

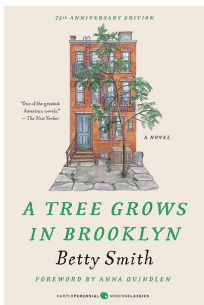

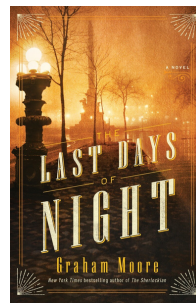

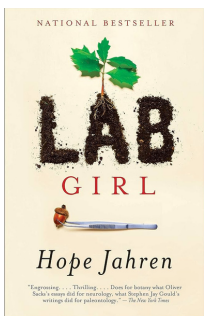

In this classic, a young girl in a shabby neighborhood lives with dreams in an innocent time before the war.



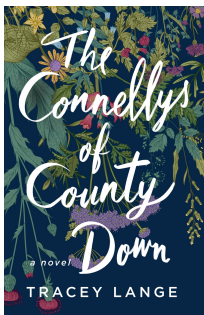
April 15, 2024 (Third Monday)

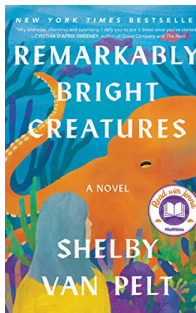
February 12, 2024

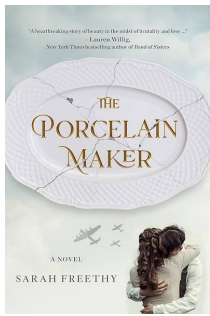
May 13, 2024

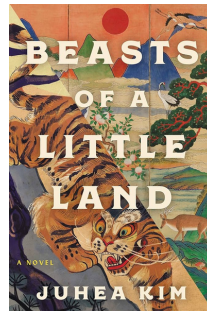

An epic story of love, betrayal, and art that spans decades, through the horrors of World War II to 21st century America, inspired by an actual porcelain factory in Dachau.

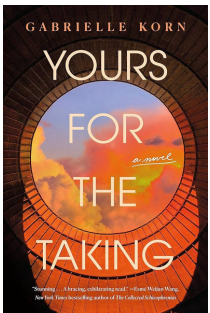

The only people guaranteed survival are the ones whose applications are accepted to The Inside Project, a series of weather-safe, city-sized structures around the world.

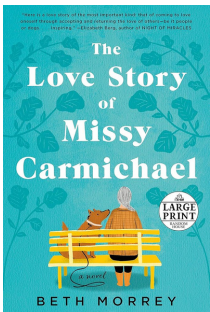


November 11, 2024

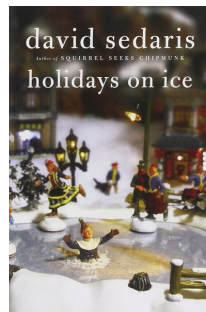


September 9, 2024
