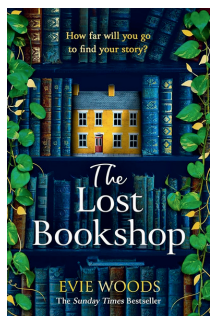

Book Club to New Worlds features a rotating selection of Fantasy, Sci-Fi, and Graphic Novels.

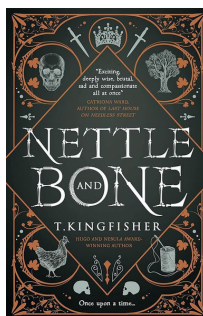


January

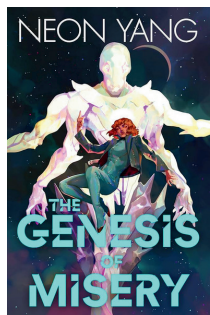


April

 by Samantha Harvey

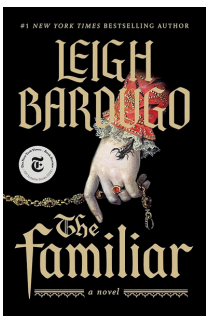

 by Andrea Rome

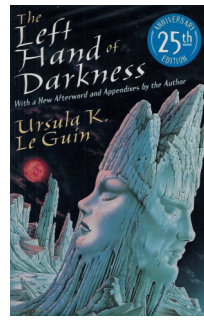

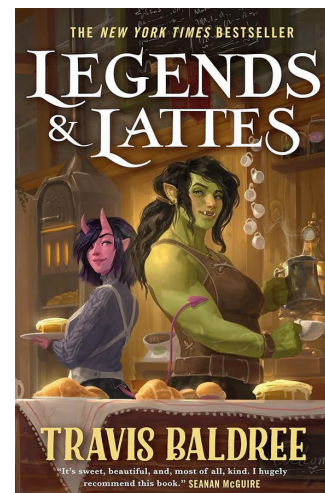


December
